Honor Guard Ceremony Federal law requires that military funeral honors include the ceremonial folding and presenting of the American flag to the deceased veteran 's next-of-kin (or other appropriate person) and the playing of Taps by a bugler, if available, or by electronic recording.

Payment for Honor Guards

When casket/urn is in place The Commander will give the following commands, ORDER ARMS, followed by the command, PARADE REST. PARADE REST. When the religious service is completed, the clergy or the funeral director will ask the mourners to stand for the rendering of the Ceremonial Volley.
