Practice National Adult Literacy and Numeracy Tests

The key skill of communication covers the use of literacy to speak and listen, and to read and write. The key skill of application of number covers the use of numeracy to interpret information, carry out calculations and interpret and present findings. The key skill of ICT covers the use of ICT to find, develop and present information.

Section 12. Planning an Adult Literacy Program

In Wales Key Skills have been replaced with Essential Skills Wales (ESW) (as of September 2010.) Essential Skills Wales is the suite of skills qualifications which replaced the previous Key Skills of Communication, Application of Number and ICT, and the Basic Skills of Adult Literacy, Adult Numeracy and Skills for Life ICT.

As with information literacy, the key is to recognize the elements of the communication situation—sender, message (subject and purpose), medium, receiver, and context. These elements are constant regardless of the medium used.
