Many parents worry about their child "appearing different" or "standing out", however if the foundational kindergarten readiness skills are not addressed early on, kids may struggle more later on, and their problems will become even more noticeable.

Writing Measurable Short and Long Term Goals

Occupational therapy is goal-oriented. Our clients may want to bear a certain weight with their arms. They may work towards returning to work full-time. Creating SMART Goals for Kids with Autism - North Shore ...

Some additional tips about goals for students with dyslexia: Goals should say either 90% or 4/5 times, but not both. Goals should be measureable. Goals should respond to each and every need identified by assessments and teacher observations. No one reading goal should include more than one component of reading. (i.e.

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
